

## **Our History**

The Refugee Development Center is a 501(c)(3) organization that was created in 2002 as a secular program of Christ Lutheran Church, obtaining independent nonprofit status in December of 2008. The mission of the RDC is to collaborate with refugees and newcomers through education, engagement and support. The RDC offers a unique, unduplicated service in the mid-Michigan area. Since 2002, the RDC has grown from one part-time staff member and a handful of volunteers with the ability to serve about 100 people per year to a staff of 12 full-time, 28 interns, 300+ volunteers, and the ability to serve over 1,500 newcomers annually! As a small grassroots organization, we have grown to be one of the most wellrespected agencies serving refugees in the region. By providing formal and informal learning opportunities, the center aims to be an open and inclusive place for refugees to learn and locate the resources they need to flourish as residents and citizens.
