Over the past year and a half, the Refugee Development Center (RDC) has continued to respond to refugee families and their needs despite the ongoing pandemic. In fact, we've welcomed nearly 300 refugees to Greater Lansing in just the past few months alone.



Among the many needs of people fleeing violence and persecution, refugee families need safe, affordable housing most of all. That's why we established the Welcome Home Fund — a fundraising effort to help refugees gain safety and stability for their families. Our goal is \$400,000 with just \$88,000 left to go.
