Digital Literacy and Learning Specialist

Overview: The Refugee Digital Literacy and Learning (DLL) Specialist will support the DLL program to ensure refugee families receive assistance as they transition into the American workforce and American school system. The goal of the program is two-fold: to provide a bridge to a broader array of career preparation services; and to lead to self-sufficiency through improved English language acquisition, trainings, skill development, social integration, job placement, job retention, and job upgrades.

HOURS: Full time; nights and weekends will be included in regular schedule
TIMELINE: Applications will be accepted until September 28, 2023.
PAY: Based on experience and certifications (\$35,360-\$39,520 annual salary)

- **Regular Support:** Stay connected with families, offering consistent guidance and support.
- Holistic Client Referral: Direct clients to additional beneficial services when required.
- **Detailed Record Keeping:** Maintain comprehensive digital records of client progress and delivered services.
- **Feedback Management:** Manage surveys and digital tracking tools to convert feedback into actionable insights.
- **Respectful Service Delivery:** Offer services with empathy and understanding, recognizing the diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds of refugees.

- Bachelor's degree in a human service-related field or combination of education and experience working with multicultural populations, preferably with refugees.
- Computer skills sufficient to perform essential functions
- Demonstrated cross cultural sensitivity
- Strong interpersonal skills, both written and verbal
- Knowledge of the U.S. public school system and state, community and agency resources
- Ability to work non-traditional hours including evenings and weekends.
- Preferred bilingual/multilingual and have experience in case management and preferably assisting with or teaching English as a Second Language.
